Silent Keys

The primary purpose of the British Columbia Public Service Net is to provide emergency coordinators with a trained group of radio operators capable of assisting with communications during an emergency. The net meets daily, 365 days per year, and provides amateurs with an opportunity to pass formal and informal traffic through a net control coordinating station.

The net started in the late 1940s when the Fraser River overflowed and Chilliwack was cut off from the world. Amateur Radio communication was vital in maintaining second tier communications. The then Section Manager Ernie Savage, **VE7FB**, and Wilf Moorhouse, **VE7US**, called together hams who were willing to help and the British Columbia Public Service Net began!


